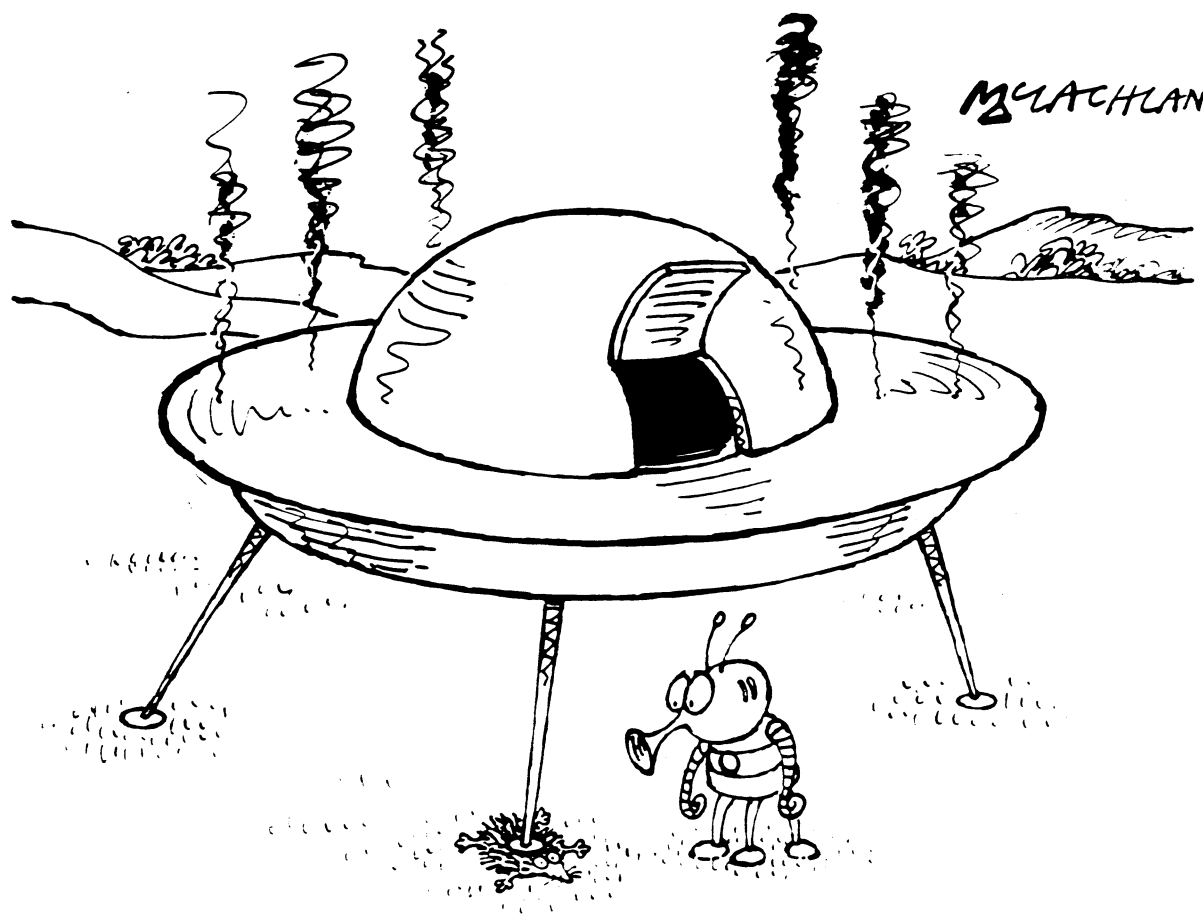

Fifty years ago on February 11th, 1942 one of the founding fathers of the Hash House Harriers fell defending Singapore in WWII. (When I say *fell*, I don't mean that he slipped on some shiggy, but that he breathed his last..) Known only as 'G', **Albert S.I. Gisbert** was the driving force of the original Hash in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in 1938. After the war, the remaining founders reformed the Hash in tribute to the memory of 'G'.

for suicide

JUMPING under a train, particularly on the London Underground, accounts for about one in 30 suicides. Over the past 50 years, 2,144 people have committed suicide on the Underground and the numbers have slowly increased each year. A report in the *International Journal of Epidemiology* reveals that more suicides are likely to take place on Mondays. Peak times are between 11am and noon and 3pm and 4pm. In the Fifties, about 70 per cent of all falls were fatal, but that has dropped to 55 per cent. The busiest stations tend to attract more victims, but there are two striking exceptions. Tooting Bec and Mile End stations have a higher than expected incident rates, but the researchers point out that both stations are major psychiatric hospitals.

A free child for the Euro guests

WHEN European Unity came in 1992, how did British hotels cope with guests who do not speak English? The AA checked by 2000, averaging Mervin Morris and Herr Meyer, each resident enough to want to bring his wife and young child to Blighty. Both guests wrote to hotels at three, four and five-star level, asking about facilities for the baby. To the 250 letters sent in French and German, 24 per cent of hotels did not reply, 22 per cent replied in English and 44 per cent attempted the foreign language. The Grand Atlantic Hotel, Weston-super-Mare, promised in French to "listen for the baby and tell you if it's raining". The Shakespeare Hotel, Stratford, told M. Morris: "We will be pleased to take care of your hedgehog" (noun, infant). The Alexandra Hotel, Oslo, wrote that hotel board would enable you to a "free child". The Swanlow Hotel, Dundee, promised baby Morris a high pupil on arrival, and the Copthorne Tara Hotel in London turned Herr Meyer down (and his wife).

Torpedo-shaped rectal suppositories are best inserted back-to-front, blunt end first, new research shows. Egyptian doctors quizzed 360 patients and 260 health workers on which end they insert first. All but two said they would insert the suppository apex first and nine out of 10 attributed their decision to common sense. But a further study on suppositories retention in 100 patients showed that back-to-front insertion was far more successful. Patients found them easier to insert blunt end first, with few needing to introduce a finger into the anal canal. Expulsion was higher among those applying common sense and inserting suppositories apex first. The authors suggest that reversed vermicular contractions or pressure gradients in the anal canal press the reversed suppository upwards (Lancet, September 28).

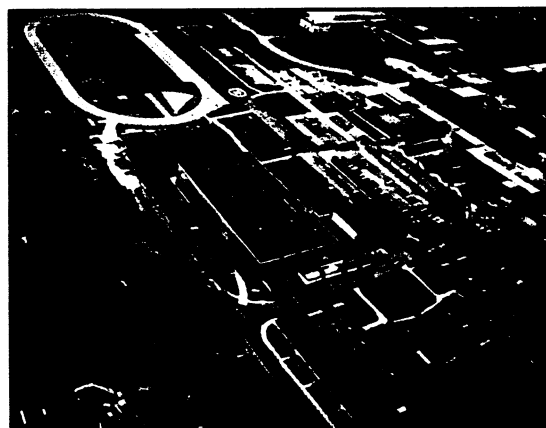
