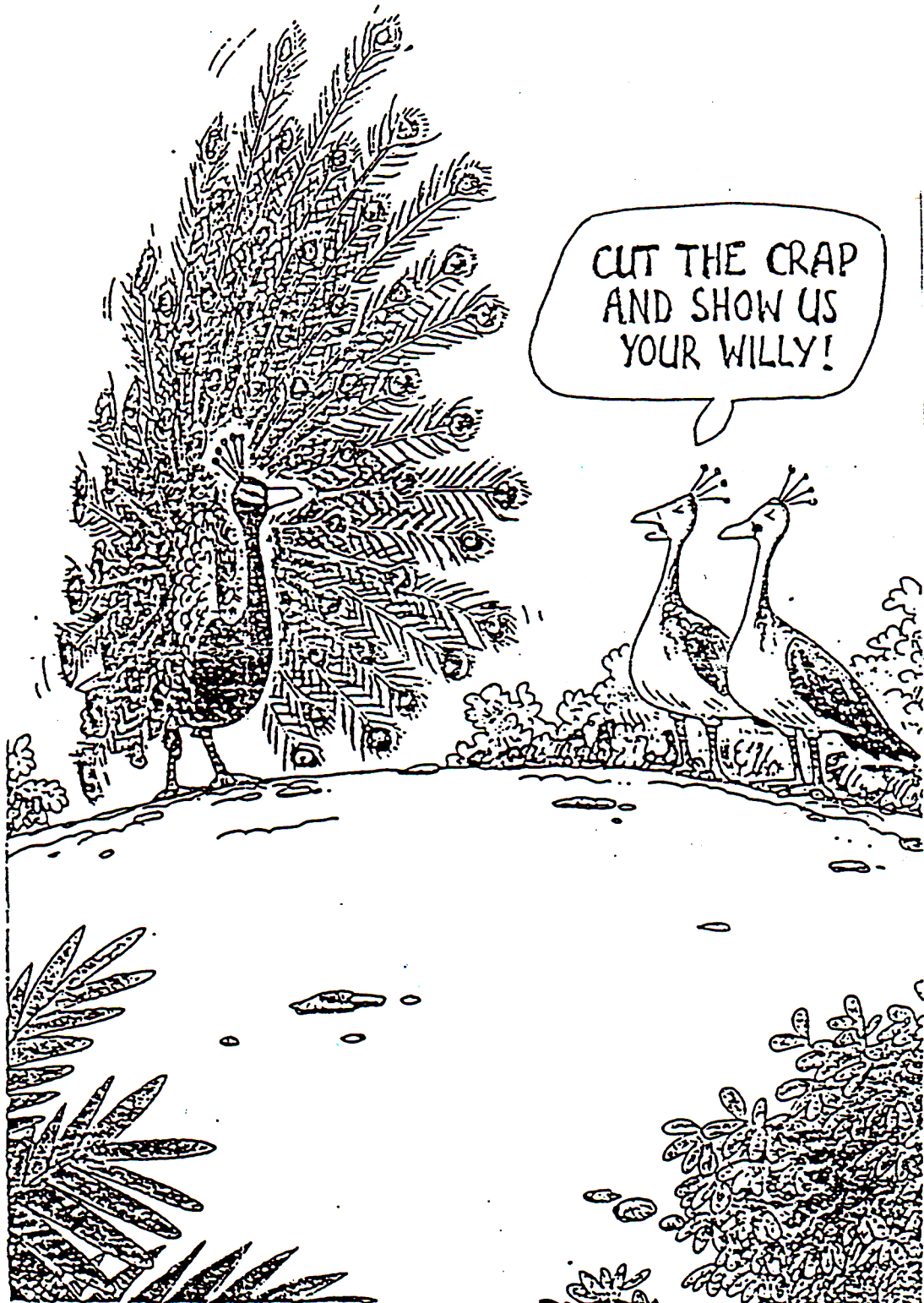

# WOODFORD RUN 18th MAY

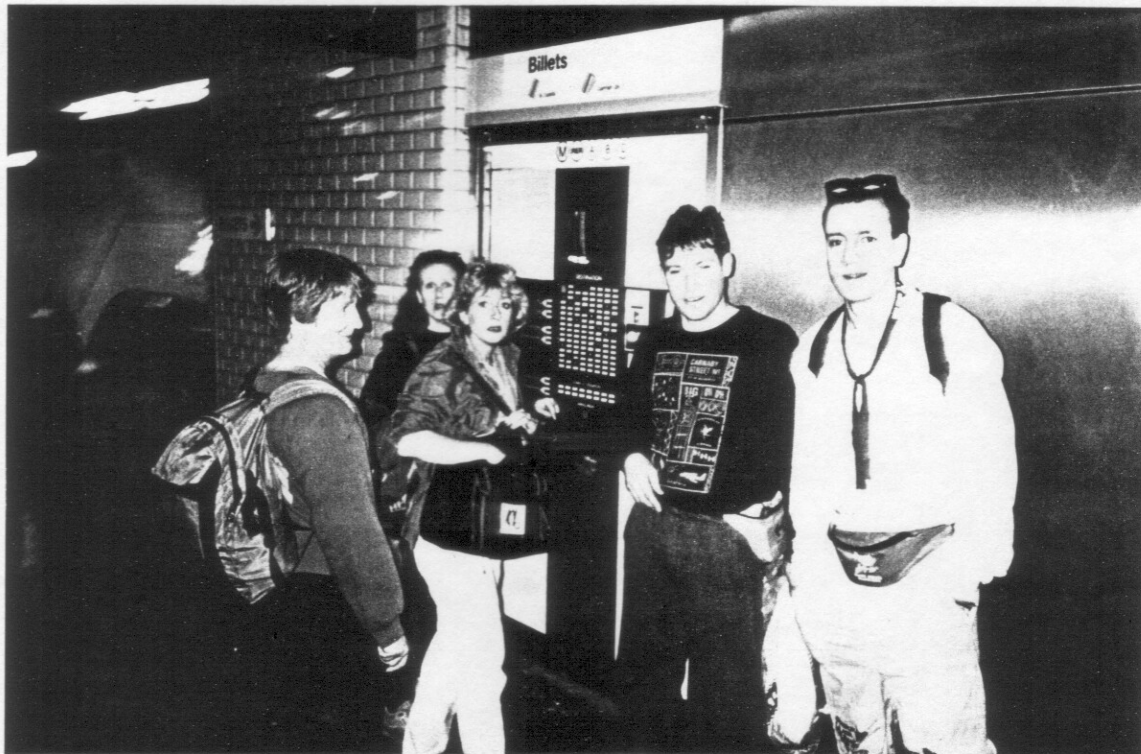

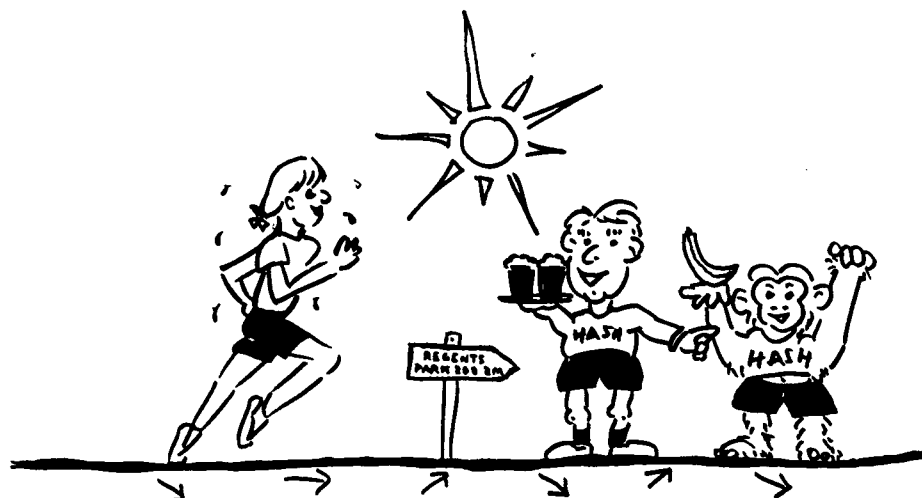

The singing started immediately, led again in our carriage by **Pope**. I couldn't hear but I presume different songs were being bawled out in each carriage. As we pulled into each station, a look of puzzled concern formed on the faces of the Parisians waiting on the platform. Cursing their luck for having stood in the wrong place on the platform, they darted hopefully (but pointlessly) to the next carriage where they surrendered and boarded the train to stand in stuffy silence for the duration.

Walking back to the hotel, **Sniffer** having had a day to practise his French chat-up lines, tried them out on an unsuspecting blonde waiting for the lights to change at a crossing. She was visibly unimpressed, and pretended not to speak French anyway.

The venue on Saturday night was the most prestigious ever to have seen a European Hash bash. Resembling a one-third size Albert Hall, the Cirque d'Hivers was previously a horse circus. **Yorkle** was the only one amongst us ancient enough to have visited it in its former guise. A novel feature was the extremely springy floor on which the lighter of us were catapulted half a metre into the air each time **Dipso** (to take a random example) landed. The grub was typical a Eurohash buffet, familiar if you have been to hash weekends in Holland, Germany and Denmark, but completely alien if you are used to bucket curries and congealed rice-blobs.

Cabaret time saw **Periodical** doing his musical bit for London, backed by a hand-picked but tone deaf backing group. The whole assembly appreciated the way in which **Periodical** kept the mike well away from **Worm**. But the most applauded act was the Paris H3 can-can. The most typically hash-like was the Paris all-male can-can. **Worm's** missing hat turned up on stage in the hands of the compere at one point having 'gone missing' on the bus before we had reached Dover.



## Dimanche

The London crowd were not to be seen at their best on Sunday morning. **Dipso** only made it back to the hotel at 7:40am. **Spunky** had survived a *menage a trois* with **Worm** and **Suzy**. **Kaffir** was ordered off the bus to pay his hotel bill. He must be short of readies now that he is no longer hash cash. **KC** was alert enough to notice that someone was missing. The trip back to London was notable mainly for the smells emanating from the on-board toilet (or **Spunky** as we call him). Whereas normal buses have the bog at the rear, ours was situated mid-bus where the smells could do most harm. Still, given that Spunky was probably going to do a helicopter halfway down the aisle anyway I suppose it was

## Police robot set to deter bad drivers

BRITAIN'S first robot policeman was unveiled yesterday by the West Mercia force.

SAM (Speed and Aggression Moderator), who was holding a radar gun, could eventually appear on kerbsides to deter speeding motorists. SAM is five foot seven and a half inches tall, wears uniform and has a papier maché head that turns slowly, powered by a small battery-charged engine.

Chief Supt Brian Humphreys, West Mercia's head of traffic, said: "SAM moves faster than the real thing."

The robot went on show at the launch of the force's new offensive against aggressive drivers. Public reaction to the idea of sending SAM on the beat will be gauged by displaying him at exhibitions this summer.

Cardboard policemen have already been used to reduce shop-lifting in supermarkets, and full-size cardboard patrol cars have been placed on motorway bridges. But police fear that SAM could be targeted by vandals if left on duty alone at the roadside.

Mr Humphreys said: "He's a futuristic model and could well become the second generation of the cardboard cutout or plastic policeman. The concept is the same — people see a policeman and they react."
